BIO:

Jodi Merryman is a casework supervisor at the RI Department of Behavioral Healthcare, Developmental Disabilities and Hospitals/Division of Developmental Disabilities. She earned her Bachelors in Social Work Degree from Providence College and her Masters Degree in Social Work from RI College. She started her career as an undergraduate intern at the RI School for the Deaf as well as a direct care staff at Corliss Center. For the last 21 years Jodi has worked for the State of RI, first at DCYF as a social worker for 10 1/2 years then the last 10 1/2 years at the Division of Developmental Disabilities being promoted to casework supervisor about 5 years ago.

Jodi has been hard of hearing since about age 3 1/2 and attended public schools. She also has a sister who is Deaf and attended the RI School for the Deaf until high school. During that time, Jodi, spent a lot of time at the school attending sign language classes and Camp MeadowWood. Jodi went on to serve on the Board of Trustees at the RI School for the Deaf from 2010-2015 serving on the policy committee, as Vice-Chair and as interim Chair.

1. Background:

What led you to be interested in serving on the Board of Trustees?

I have previously served on the Board from 2010-2015 and saw it through some very challenging times. After taking some personal time I am interested in returning to continue to support the school in moving forward on its way to becoming a school that the people of RI can be proud of.

2. Qualifications:

What qualities and strengths from your background and experience will you bring to the Board if you are chosen to serve?

I feel I have a number of qualities and strengths that I could bring to the Board.
